

Working with Residents to Improve Traffic Issues in Perry Vale

They fully support the views of their community neighbours who responded to the "Having problems with parking?" consultation that showed no overall liking for Controlled Parking Zones across the ward.

At the moment, **John, Alan and Susan** are working with residents to focus on the traffic problems in Perry Vale and Perry Rise, because these are roads where you have expressed concerns over the traffic speeds. Your Labour councillors have also organised two meetings to gather residents views over road safety in the ward and they are working the local Police Safer Neighbourhood Team to identify other roads where traffic offences may be happening.

Tories cut your Police

Lewisham West MP, Jim Dowd and Steve Bullock, Mayor of Lewisham and have slammed the proposed cuts in Police numbers put forward by Tory Mayor of London, Boris Johnson. The plans will cut 455 officers from patrolling London's streets and put at risk the future of our popular and successful Safer Neighbourhood Teams (SNT),

particularly in Perry Vale. Jim has raised the issue in Parliament and Steve has written to Boris Johnson directly demanding an explanation. Labour Councillor John Paschoud said "Labour introduced SNTs so residents have a visible, contactable and local police service. The Tories should be backing SNTs, not trying to cut them."

Decent Homes for Perry Vale with L+Q



Overwhelming support from tenants in Perry Vale to transfer to London and Quadrant Housing Association later in 2010 will bring a range of improvements including new bathrooms, kitchens and windows to their homes. L+Q will also consult on installing entry-phone systems and improving fencing, lighting and railings to some areas.

New Leisure and Swimming in the area



Last year, Lewisham's Labour Mayor, Sir Steve Bullock, decided that work should start immediately for the pools to be redeveloped on the existing site and to include the integration of its much loved Victorian frontage. The pools planning application will be heard in May 2010, and Lewisham Council aims to reopen the new facility in 2012.
